

The Michigan Department of Community Health (MDCH) is working closely with the Department of Technology, Management and Budget on a rebid for the Medicaid Health Plan program effective October 1, 2015. MDCH's vision is to create a Medicaid managed care system that maximizes the health status of beneficiaries through evidence and value-based care delivery models. We are committed to four pillars essential to this vision:

- Population Health Management
- Pay for Value
- Integration of Care
- Structural Transformation

These pillars are supported by health information technology and a robust, overarching quality strategy.

Stakeholder input is crucial in this rebid process. MDCH is extremely interested in hearing from stakeholders throughout the state about:

1. what is or is not working in the current Medicaid health plan program, and
2. ways to use this rebid to improve care and service delivery for beneficiaries

MDCH has requested assistance from the Institute for Health Policy, Michigan State University to conduct a web-based survey to capture comments from all interested parties.
