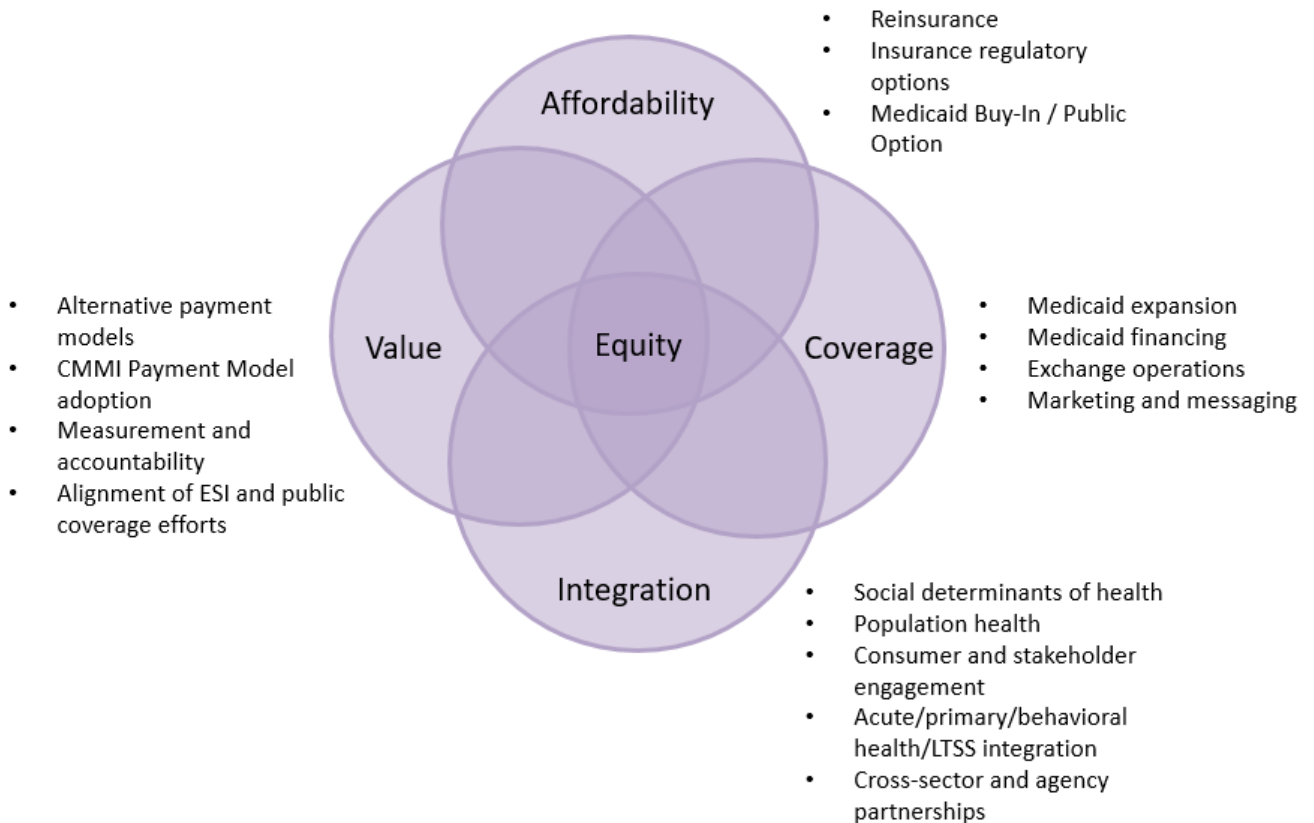


ABOUT STATE HEALTH AND VALUE STRATEGIES:

	<p>Health Transformation Office Hours</p> <p>Expert insights via webinars or all state calls on policy issues</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Technical experts or state officials identify topics with questions • States are invited to ask questions before and during all-state call
	<p>Peer-to-Peer Learning</p> <p>In-person convenings, webinars and affinity group conference calls</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Technical experts facilitate conversations and states share experiences on specific topic areas • Could be one-off topics or continuing series
	<p>Dissemination</p> <p>Publish issue briefs in topic areas. Learnings from technical assistance projects, including policy impacts or operational best practices, will be documented and shared.</p>
	<p>Connection with Federal Policymakers</p> <p>Program staff serve as feedback loop with federal policymakers, providing insights about intended state activity and sharing learnings back to states.</p>
