



Health Insurance Options during COVID-19

STATE wants you to know there are health insurance options available to you at this time. We are taking steps to make sure more RESIDENTS can enroll in coverage, to reduce costs for services related to COVID-19, and to provide financial help or low-cost/free health insurance to those who have recently lost their job, seen a cut in their hours or remain uninsured. Here's what you need to know:

- If you've recently lost your job, you qualify for a special enrollment period (SEP) and can shop for and enroll in a plan at MARKETPLACE. You may qualify for financial help to pay for your plan.
- FOR STATES WITH COVID-19 SEPs LEAD WITH THIS: MARKETPLACE has announced a special enrollment period for all RESIDENTS from DATE to DATE for anyone who needs health insurance as this critical time. Visit X.org to shop and compare plans and see if you qualify for financial help to pay for your plan.
- Depending on your income, you and your family may qualify for low-cost or free health insurance through [MEDICAID] and the [CHILDREN'S HEALTH INSURANCE PROGRAM]. Enrollment in these programs is open year-round. Medicaid provides comprehensive coverage and is there for people who fall on hard times and need help. Visit X.org to see if you qualify.
- All MARKETPLACE plans cover comprehensive benefits like doctor's visits, hospitalizations, prescriptions, mental health services and more. [IF APPLICABLE] Governor X also announced that all (TESTING AND/OR TREATMENT) related to COVID-19 will be covered at no cost to you, regardless of your plan or insurance status.
- If you currently have a MARKETPLACE plan and your income has recently decreased, visit X.org or call X to see if you can save money on your current plan. You might qualify for financial help – or receive more financial help – to help lower your costs.
